WHO DO WE WORSHIP AND WHY? The question asked here is: who we should worship and why. However, we also look at our inbuilt desire to worship, and how something is getting our worship all the time - even if it is not God.

IS THERE A WRONG AND RIGHT WAY TO WORSHIP? What are some of the misconceptions about worship and how do we seek God's heart for worship, in order to avoid doing what others do (simply because it has always been done before).

WORSHIP IN SPIRIT AND IN TRUTH - John 4 talks about worship not being bound by time or place, so we explore what scripture says about worshipping in spirit and in truth.

OUR JOURNEY AS WORSHIPPERS - According to John 4, God seeks worshippers not worship - so let us explore what scripture says about worshippers and our daily journey of bringing glory to God.

worship is...

Worship is the *response* of *grateful* and *humble* people to the *living God* where *submission, sacrificial service, praise, profession, testimony* and *gratitude* are freely expressed in innumerable ways.

This is a much *richer* concept than mere corporate singing and praise once each week for 20 minutes - an event that could occur without any actual worship going on at all.
